Itoya uses local ingredients and you can enjoy seasonal foods such as *sansai* (edible, wild plants) in spring and mushrooms in fall.

Soba

A Korean-style pub where guests can not only enjoy Korean dishes such as charcoal-grilled *samgyeopsal* (Korean pork belly), but also the atmosphere of Korea itself.

Offers generous meals with fresh seasonal seafood, edible wild plants, and a variety of other homemade dishes. Especially recommended are the charcoal-grilled foods and the chef's original dishes. Soba

Japanese/Izakaya

Kirakuya uses only fresh yakitori made right at the restaurant (never frozen or pre-made) and each skewer is grilled over hot charcoal. Come on, yakitori lovers!

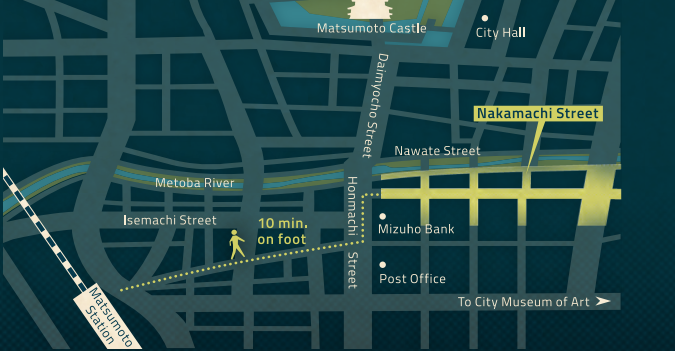

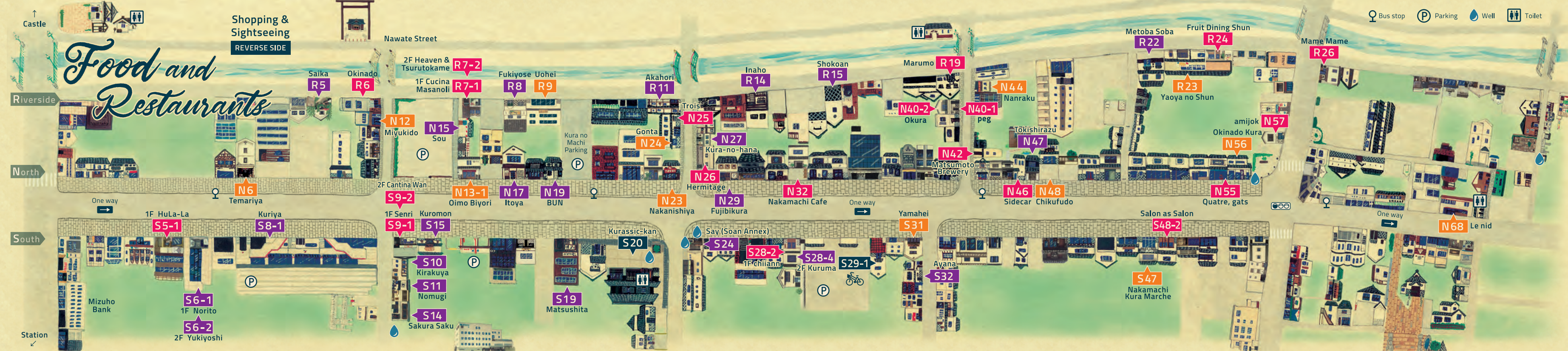
About Nakamachi

Ever since the 17th century, Nakamachi has prospered as the backbone of the castle town of Matsumoto. It was a town on the old Zenkoji Kaido, a route connecting Zenkoji Temple to Nagoya and Kyoto. Since old times, it was a prosperous merchants' town where many wholesale stores (mainly sake brewers and kimono merchants) were located.

Currently, Nakamachi has a variety of shops including folk art shops, craft shops and restaurants, as well as the Kurassic-kan, which was once a sake brewery building, and the Scale Museum which is housed in a former scale shop.



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Western-style Restaurant / Café / Bar / Misc.

R6 Okinado

Western-style restaurant
Founded in 1933, Okinado serves pork and beef steaks, and dishes using vegetables grown on their own organic farm. Great place to relax and enjoy classic western-style meals.

R19 Marumo

Café
The cafe is part of Marumo Ryokan and has been open since 1956. The ryokan was founded in 1868, with the current kura-style building being constructed after the great fire in Matsumoto in 1888. Furnished throughout with Matsumoto folk furniture, relax and enjoy the historic atmosphere of this café!

R24 Fruit Dining Shun

Café
Run by a wholesaler from Matsumoto Public Market, this shop offers various seasonal fruit items including fruit jelly, fresh juices, crepes, and pancakes. A small space to sit and eat is available.

R26 Mame Mame

Matsumoto-style pancakes
A shop specializing in a local dish called "usuyaki" (Matsumoto-style pancakes). All foods are natural, so parents can rest assured that children are eating something healthy. Both eat-in and take-out available. High-energy foods for trekking and the light breakfast are also recommended.

N26 Hermitage

Bar
Enjoy dining while listening to live piano music at this adult-oriented dinner bar, which makes a great hide-away where you can relax with the music at the end of the day.

A cozy and casual wine bar/café where you can enjoy natural wines (vin naturel) and specialty coffee starting at lunchtime. You will find a good selection of natural wines from Japan, as well.

Kura

In 1888, most of Nakamachi burnt down in a big fire. In response, many fire-resistant kura-style (earth-thatched) buildings were built to protect the town from fire. The kura-style buildings are decorated in a unique style using a white, mortar grid pattern on black tiles called "namako" walls. They were used as storehouses and sometimes also as residences. Even today, many such buildings remain around the Nakamachi area.

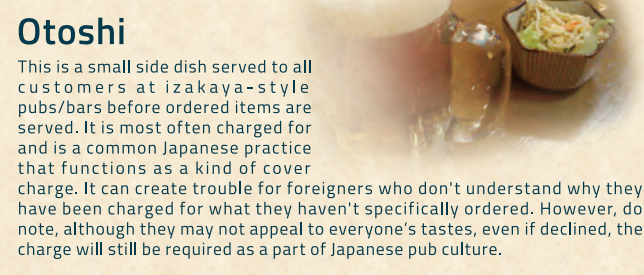


Wells

Matsumoto has an abundant supply of natural ground water and several old wells can still be found in the city. There are a few wells in Nakamachi and the surrounding neighborhoods including the hand-pump well at Kurassic-kan. The water is safe for drinking. Check the locations on the map!

Izakaya

A traditional, Japanese-style bar that serves a variety of food.



Otoshi

This is a small side dish served to all customers at izakaya-style pubs/bars before ordered items are served. It is most often charged for and is a common Japanese practice that functions as a kind of cover charge. It can create trouble for foreigners who don't understand why they have been charged for what they haven't specifically ordered. However, do note, although they may not appeal to everyone's tastes, even if declined, the charge will still be required as a part of Japanese pub culture.



Sanzokuyaki

"Bandit chicken" A local dish with marinated, chunky, deep-fried chicken

Soba

Buckwheat noodles, famous in Nagano. They can be served as hot noodles, with trimmings such as tempura or edible wild plants, or served chilled on a basket as "Zaru Soba."

Farmers Market

Farmers from around Matsumoto bring seasonal vegetables, flowers, fruit and fruit juice, edible wild plants, and mushrooms to this morning market. It is very popular as the produce is both fresh and inexpensive and the farmers give the market-goers tips on cooking and pickling.

Matsumoto Bon Bon

Tens of thousands of people dance on the streets of Matsumoto. The first Sat. of Aug.

Ameichi (Candy Festival)

Nakamachi's portable shrines go around the streets of Matsumoto. Held on a weekend in early or mid-Jan.

Shimin (Citizens') Festival

A colorful festival with a samurai procession, vehicle free streets, and plenty of street stalls. Nov 3rd.

Tenjin Festival

Fukashi Shrine's lively annual festival where traditional wooden floats, including those from Nakamachi, parade through the streets. July 24th and 25th.

On Sep. 6 (Wed) and Sep. 23 (Sat), 2017, enjoy a special Japanese culture experience at Kurassic-kan.

9:30 - 17:00 Closed: Dec. 29 - Jan. 3. The Kurassic-kan buildings were part of a nearby sake brewery built in 1888 and 1923. The main building is often used for exhibition and cultural events, while another building has a small tearoom and cafe inside. Kurassic-kan is free to walk around in, and inside you can see its impressive wooden structural beams, tatami rooms and small Japanese garden.

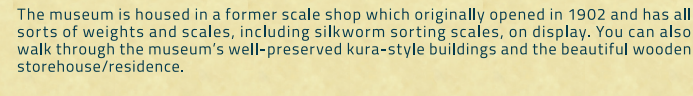

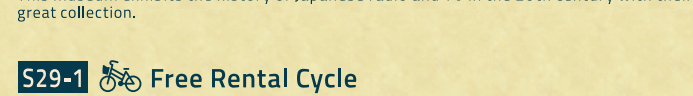

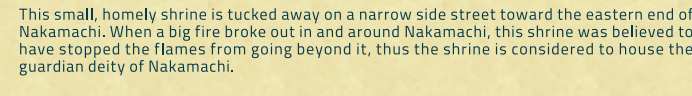

This small, homely shrine is tucked away on a narrow side street toward the eastern end of Nakamachi. When a big fire broke out in and around Nakamachi, this shrine was believed to have stopped the flames from going beyond it, thus the shrine is considered to house the guardian deity of Nakamachi.



Located across the river from Nakamachi, Nawate Street is a car-free zone lined with small eateries and quirky shops where you can buy trinkets and Japanese-style snacks. The street retains its Edo-style atmosphere and is popular with tourists. You will also find Yohashira Shrine along this street.
